## 1. UNIFORM POLICY AND REGULATIONS

- a) The wearing of the full College uniform is compulsory for all students. This handbook is provided to all families upon enrolment and annually thereafter and is the authoritative reference for College uniform matters. Please keep this handbook to avoid later confusion.
- b) If a student is unable to wear any item of the correct uniform on a particular day, an explanatory note must be sent by a parent to the class teacher before schools starts in the morning.
- c) If a student is found to be wearing incorrect uniform the following steps will be implemented:
  - i. a note will be sent home to correct the fault;
  - ii. if this is not forthcoming the parents will be contacted by the College to discuss the issue;
  - iii. students may be excluded from attending school for repeated uniform infringements.
- d) The cooperation of parents and students in maintaining the high standards of appearance expected of our students is much appreciated.

## 2. UNIFORM SHOP

### Location:

Kenwick Campus (Entry via Brixton Street). The shop is located in the rear of the Rehoboth Centre (gymnasium building). Please park in the main car park, and proceed along the verandah to the right of the Rehoboth Centre, turning left into the central courtyard. The shop is then located at the end of the courtyard, behind and to the left of the stage area. Please do not access the shop through the gym.

### Regular Opening Hours (as of Term 1 2019):

Tuesday 8:30-10:00am 2:30-4:00pm

Thursday 8:30-10:00am

Special “back-to-school” opening hours are usually scheduled in January each year to help parents and students prepare for the year ahead. These will be published in our newsletters and website.

## 3. COMPULSORY UNIFORM REGULATIONS

<b>Labelling</b>	All clothing and personal items, including shoes, must be clearly marked with the student's name (not initials only).
<b>Jewellery</b>	<p>Non-permitted jewellery will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day.</p> <p>Girls may wear stud or sleeper type earrings only (one earring per ear only).</p> <p>Boys may not wear earrings, including immediately following ear piercing. Boys wishing to have ears pierced should do so during a holiday break, allowing sufficient time for the healing process to be complete before the student returns to school.</p> <p>Bangles, necklaces, or dangling earrings are not acceptable due to safety concerns.</p>
<b>Hair (Girls)</b>	Hair which is shoulder-length or longer is to be tied up and back and/or plaited. The hair style must allow for unobstructed eye contact between the student and the teachers, and without hair falling over the eyes so that the student can see effectively to work. Untidy, extreme or faddish hair styles or colours, as determined by the College, are not permitted.
<b>Hair (Boys)</b>	Hair must be cut so that it is above the collar, above the eyebrows and above the ears. Untidy, extreme, or faddish hair styles or colours, as determined by the College, are not permitted.
<b>College Hats</b>	Only College hats are to be worn. The College has a "No Hat, No Play" policy that is in effect during Term 1 and from 1 September each year into and including Term 4.
<b>Accessories</b>	<p>Hair accessories should be simple and unobtrusive. All ribbons, bobbles and head-bands are to be red, white, navy blue (College uniform colours) only, and in plain designs (i.e. no lace ribbons or fancy bands).</p> <p>Dyed and bleached hair is not permitted. Sprayed hair is banned on Sport Carnival days.</p> <p>The College reserves the right to ask a student not to wear a particular style of accessory.</p>
<b>Make-up</b>	No make-up, nail polish, or coloured/patterned acrylic nails are to be worn at school.
<b>Swimming</b>	All bathers are to be modest and decent, and one piece only.
<b>Library bags</b>	PVC-backed poly cotton, water proof. These are available for purchase at the Uniform Shop, but may be purchased elsewhere.
<b>School bags</b>	The Rehoboth school bag is compulsory for all students in Years 1-6.



**Lost property** The College takes no responsibility for lost clothing. At the end of each Term, all lost property will be donated to the Second-Hand Uniform Shop for resale.

## 4. KINDERGARTEN TO PRE-PRIMARY UNIFORM (BOYS AND GIRLS)

- Parents are encouraged to obtain all uniform items from the College Uniform Shop located at the Kenwick Campus, as this ensures a high standard of dress is maintained across the College. Students are generally not permitted to wear “similar” items purchased from other retailers, though parents may discuss this with their Principal.
- The Uniform Shop does not carry footwear, and appropriate shoes may be purchased from other retailers.
- Please note that any garments such as singlets should not be visible outside the College polo shirt.

### SUMMER

<b>Shirt</b>	Red shirt with embroidered crest.
<b>Shorts</b>	Navy blue rugby knit.
<b>Jacket</b>	Zip-up style royal blue with crest.
<b>Footwear</b>	Sandals (navy, black or brown) secured with front and ankle straps and a low heel.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.
<b>Tracksuit top</b>	Navy with red trim, as worn for sports (optional).

### WINTER

<b>Shirt</b>	Red shirt with embroidered crest.
<b>Jacket</b>	Zip-up style style with crest.
<b>Trackpants</b>	Navy with cuffs.
<b>Footwear</b>	Sport shoes – should be predominantly white or black and may include coloured trim.
<b>Socks</b>	White ankle length, to cover ankle bone.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.



## 5. YEAR 1-6 UNIFORM

- Parents are encouraged to obtain all uniform items from the College Uniform Shop located at the Kenwick Campus, as this ensures a high standard of dress is maintained across the College. Students are generally not permitted to wear “similar” items purchased from other retailers, though parents may discuss this with their Principal.
- The Uniform Shop does not carry footwear, and appropriate shoes may be purchased from other retailers.

### 5.1 Girls' Uniform

#### SUMMER

<b>Polo shirt</b>	Blue with embroidered crest
<b>Skort</b>	Pleated tartan navy skort
<b>Jacket</b>	1. Zip-up style royal blue with crest. 2. Navy with red trim, can be worn with uniform and during sport all year round.
<b>Footwear</b>	1. Sandals (navy, black or brown) secured with front and side straps and a low heel. 2. Black leather lace-up, buckles, or Velcro strap school shoes with a low heel.
<b>Socks</b>	White ankle length, to cover ankle bone.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.

#### WINTER

<b>Polo shirt</b>	Blue with embroidered crest
<b>Skort</b>	Pleated tartan navy skort
<b>Jacket</b>	1. Zip-up style royal blue with crest. 2. Navy with red trim, can be worn with uniform and during sport all year round.
<b>Tracksuit top</b>	Navy with red trim (optional) – can be worn with uniform and during sport all year round.
<b>Trousers</b>	Navy blue slacks.
<b>Tights</b>	Plain Navy tights, without socks – to be worn only with skort.
<b>Footwear</b>	Black leather lace-up, buckles, or velcro straps school shoes with a low heel.
<b>Socks</b>	Navy socks – to be worn with trousers only.



	White ankle length, to cover ankle bone with sports shoes or black shoes only.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.
<b>Scarf/gloves</b>	Navy scarf and gloves (optional).

## 5.2 Boys' Uniform

### SUMMER

<b>Polo shirt</b>	Blue with embroidered crest.
<b>Shorts</b>	Navy school shorts.
<b>Jacket</b>	Zip-up style royal blue with crest.
<b>Footwear</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Sandals (navy, black or brown) secured with front and side straps and a low heel.</li><li>2. Black leather lace-up, buckles, or Velcro strap school shoes with a low heel.</li></ol> No desert boots or leather sport shoes.
<b>Socks</b>	Navy school sock.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.

### WINTER

<b>Polo shirt</b>	Blue with printed crest
<b>Shorts</b>	Navy school shorts (optional for Winter)
<b>Jacket</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Zip-up style royal blue with crest.</li><li>2. Navy with red trim, can be worn with uniform and during sport all year round.</li></ol>
<b>Trousers</b>	Navy trousers with College name embroidered.
<b>Footwear</b>	Black leather lace-up, buckles, or Velcro strap school shoes with a low heel. No desert boots or leather sport shoes.
<b>Socks</b>	Navy school sock.
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.



## 6. SPORTS UNIFORM

The sport uniform applies to both girls and boys.

<b>Sport shirt</b>	Red shirt with embroidered crest – required for Interschool Carnivals only.
<b>House shirt</b>	Appropriate House shirts – may be worn for PE lessons and House Carnivals.
<b>Shorts</b>	Navy micro fibre with College name embroidered.
<b>Jacket</b>	1. Zip-up style royal blue with crest. 2. Navy with red trim, can be worn during sport all year round.
<b>Footwear</b>	Sports shoes – should be predominantly white or black and may include coloured trim.
<b>Socks</b>	White ankle length, to cover ankle bone
<b>Hat</b>	Navy with crest, to be worn outside for sun protection – only College hats are to be worn.

## 7. BLACK LEATHER LACE-UP SCHOOL SHOES

We want to avoid having footwear becoming an area for competition among students, and are expecting students to wear a conservative, mainstream style of shoe that supports their feet.

Please contact the Campus Office if there may be any doubt the suitability of shoes you are considering purchasing.

**The College will be unable to approve unsuitable shoes simply because they have been purchased and worn.** There are many suitable styles of shoes available, so there is no reason for students to buy unsuitable styles.

### 7.1 Style guide

If you choose to shop for shoes at Betts Kids, the following guide to suitable styles will be helpful.

- Suitable Betts range: Express, Stitch, Subject, Trilogy, Urgent
- Suitable Clarks range: Achieve, Daytona, Elise, Library, Reward

#### **All styles black only**

- Unsuitable Betts range: Indiana, Raider, Swing



## 7.2 Examples of suitable styles

These are examples only – there will be other similar styles which will also be acceptable. Important features include:

- The shoe must be fastened with laces, buckles, or Velcro straps – no slip-ons or elastic straps are permitted.
- The shoe must have a dress-style/normal school-style upper, without sport-style features.
- The shoe must have a heel which extends for the width of the shoe.
- All heels are to be no higher than 45mm as measured to the bottom of the welt at the back of the heel.
- The shoe must be completely black, without coloured laces, stitching or other coloured features.
- The base of the sole may have a “rugged” appearance if desired, but care must be taken that this does not give the shoe a resemblance to a sport-style shoe.
- The shoe must fit below the ankle, rather than above – the shoe must not be any kind of boot. A doctor’s or podiatrist’s letter is required if a variation is required to this standard for medical reasons, and discussion with the College should take place before selecting footwear in such a case.

## 8. SECOND-HAND UNIFORM ITEMS

The College operates a Second-Hand Uniform Shop at both campuses.

**Kenwick:** The shop currently operates from the demountable behind Room G in the Secondary School. The shop is open Wednesday mornings, 8:30-9:30am, and is managed by Mrs Nicky de Jongh.
